Quirin Krumbholz | Selected Works ²⁰²³



Quirin Krumbholz was born in Munich, Germany and is currently living and working in Vienna, Austria.

His work covers interdisciplinary research on art, design, architecture and technology. While crossing borders between the different fields, he is creating unexpected and meaningful relations between objects, subjects, theories and artisanry.

He studied at the Bauhaus University Weimar and 'dieAngewandte', University for Applied Arts, Studio Wolf D. Prix, in Vienna. He participated in multiple shows in the architectural context over the last 10 years, noticebly the artistic research project 'fluid bodies', funded by the FWF PEEK program between 2018 and 2020.

His first solo exhibition 'north of nothing' was shown in Vienna in 2022. Selected works were featured in the same year at the VRHAM in Hamburg, the Progress in Architecture conference at Belvedere 21 in Vienna and the IMM Cologne.


On Magnetic Casting

Magnetic fields have the potential, to form and control matter.

Applied in the artistic process, internal permanent- & electromagnetic forces can entirely remove the last traces of conventional formwork.

Eventually developed at the end of the research project 'Fluid Bodies', force and matter became a new kind of artistic condition, that is dynamic and stable at the same time.

Realizing and developing the potential by countless experiments, was the point of depature for this portfolio.




Bipolar

is an extended void, stretched by two repelling objects. They are creating a 'void' over almost one meter.

Held only by strings and in perfect balance, the composition reveals a very strong repulsing force, interacting inside the void.

The closer one gets,
the stronger manifests a presence of two individuals,
with unique characteristics,
both not able to stabilize themselves without the other.



Bipolar is one of the most challenging installations, with a combined contact pressure of 500kg for both magnets, if orientated on alternating poles.

In Bipolar the two magnets are orientated safely, on repulsion.



Fluid Bodies

are physical interactive sculptures
that reveal their fluidity
when carefully interacting with their surface
(i.e. blowing lightly)

The observable effects defy our common intuition of liquid matter under the influence of gravity.

The objects in the photos are about 10cm in diameter.

Powder Beastie

The 'sea of stories' series can be presented as a performative installation, allowing observes to 'play' and immerse with the constant flow of changing patterns.

Hedgehog Series

The 'Hedgehogs' resemble living entities, crawling their way through time.

They leave no trace, wandering on ceilings, over walls or floors.


While their distant primary movement seems to be iterative and timeless, the closeup reveals a constant change in its inherent structure, that appears to be a swarm of smaller individuals, rather than one body or organism.

It askes questions about the recognition of systems on either close up or far distant perspectives and what we are able to perceive (or not) from very different positions.

Hedgehogs can come as singles or multiples, on the same mirror canvas. They work as ceiling, wall and stand up installations at the same time.



One on Two

is a spatial compressor, exploring the boundary condition of perceivable nothingness.

By creating a framework similar to a synaptic gap that looks empty to the human eye, the constant flow of forces only emerges in the observing mind.



One on Two is a scalable installation setup. Other tested working setups are:

Mirrortest

or MSR* plays with the unanswered question, how the faunal biodiversity manifests self-recognition.

From our current understanding, there are just very few species that have passed the MSR test.

Some species that did, include primates, asiatic elephants, dolphins, orcas, the eurasian magpie, and the cleaner wrasse.

*The test itself is discussed quite controversial among scientists and researchers especially for species that primarily use senses other than vision.

"For example, dogs mainly use smell and hearing; vision is used third." (Bekoff, Marc (19 September 2002). "Animal reflections". Nature. 419)



The Mirrortest Series comes in different sizes, with single or multiple subjects and also works as ceiling installations.





was another point of departure,
for artistically manifesting the fundamental electromagnetic forces
that are imperceptible for the human senses,
without direct interaction.

The visually chaotic randomness in the surfaces, created by the same physical force that holds them together, contrasts the perfect balance, within the composition as a whole.




French Kiss

is revealing all the static mechanical parts which manifest the physical process of the inherent magnetic force.

An externally triggered spinning of the top against the bottom part results in a fluctuated touching and a partial exchange of the liquids.

In those moments when the liquids touch, observers experience a singular, instead of a binary interpretation of the sculpture, for a short period of time.

Round Table

is a series of 9 distinct surface refinements, resulting in very individual characters bound together along a virtual string on the discourse:

freedom <> equality

equality <> freedom


solidarity <> individualism

It is the first work of the series 'articel I', discussing semantic issues about the reconcilability of fundamental values within the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR):

"All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights.

They are endowed with reason and conscience
